PROCEEDINGS OF COURT—MAY 1858.

David Adams vs. Geo. B. Engle's Adm'rs.—This was an action of covenant, upon two articles of agreement made in 1839 and 1841, for the sale of land and forge property from Adams to Engle. After the trial had been commenced, the Plaintiff took a non-suit, and the jury was discharged.— Linn and Wallace for Plff.; Hale and McNally for the Defts.

H. F. Rider & wife vs. Eliza Irwin.—Action of trespass for goods belonging to Mrs. Rider, which it was alleged the Deft. had taken and retained. Verdict for Plffs. for \$215.00.— McNally for Plffs.; Wallace for Deft.

C. P. Hinds vs. George Mason.—Action of partition for land which plaintiff alleged that he and defendant held together. Deft. denied that they held in common, and alleged that his own possession was adverse to that of the plaintiff. After hearing the evidence, the Plff. suffered a non-suit.— Swoope for plaintiff; Wallace for defendant.

Samuel Ritter vs. Harzthal & Brother.—Action of assumpsit for a balance of about \$550.00 claimed to be due to plaintiff for mill-wright work in building a grist-mill for defts. in 1852. The defence set up that the work was not done according to contract, but in a defective and unworkmanlike manner. Verdict for defendants.— Swoope for Plff.; McNally for Defendants.

Thomas B. Davis vs. James McCracken and Matthew Bloom.—Action of debt on bond given during the pendency of a former action of ejectment to allow the removal of timber from the land then in dispute. Verdict for Plff. for \$34.29.— McNally for plaintiff; Wallace for Defendants.

Commonwealth vs. Henry Sowers.—Indictment for fornication and bastardy. Tried and verdict rendered of guilty. McCullough, Swoope and McNally for the Com'th; Curtin and Linn for deft.

Commonwealth vs. Daniel Moore.—Indictment for obtaining money under false pretences. Tried and verdict of guilty. Deft. sentenced to pay fine of \$2.01 and costs and to be imprisoned 10 days.— McCullough for Com'th; Swoope for Deft.

Licenses were granted to nearly all applicants. The Court held that under the late law they had no right to refuse where the person applying had complied with its provisions. A large amount of other business, which did not come before a Jury, was disposed of by the Court.

The court adjourned on Thursday morning, the 29th, having been kept busy about 2 days.

COMMITTED.—Two men named Hiram and Jonathan Hemans were lodged in our county jail on last Sunday, on a charge of being implicated in the robbery of Wm. Irvin's store in Curwensville, several weeks since. The store was broken into on the night of Saturday the 24th April, and a lot of clothing, a rifle gun and a shot gun were among the articles known to be stolen. Several articles of the clothing were found in the possession of persons to whom one of the men arrested had sold them. Hiram intimates that the robbery was committed by two or three of his boys, who have left for parts unknown.

Mr. Davenport has recovered the horse.
