The damage to public property in Hamilton county, Ohio, by the great freshet on the 27th ult., is estimated by the Board of Commissioners at \$100,000. This, says the Cincinnati Commercial, does not include the damage to private property, which is probably double that amount.

There are advertisements of farms and city lots in Cook county, Ill., to be sold for taxes, covering eighty-two columns of the Chicago papers. About sixty of these columns belong to Chicago & vicinity, which is included in the above county.

The estimated damage by the disastrous covease at Bell's plantation, two miles above New Orleans, is from four to five millions of dollars. The plantation was one of the best sugar plantations so badly submerged that it can be estimated as a crop from them, for at least two seasons to come.

The Herald of Freedom says: Our friends in the States need not have fears about the fate of the Lecompton Swindlers, now that it is submitted to the people of Kansas. Whether it is submitted to them, it will be buried beyond the possibility of a resurrection. The masses of all parties are bound to defeat it.

Mrs. Vilette, of La Salle, was buried recently in the Catholic burying ground, at Monroe, Michigan. She was 112 years old at the time of her death. She made her will in the latter part of the last century, and what is most singular, she has outlived all the persons to whom she had bequeathed her property.

A correspondent of the Philadelphia Press says that one of the Pennsylvania members of Congress, when the Lecompton Bill was in full blast, walked up to the President and spoke as follows: "I shall swallow this dose, sir; for if I don't, the politicians will take the nomination from me; and if I do, the people will take the election from me—so I am gone anyhow." That was Giltner.

The new liquor law promises plenty of food for litigation and fees for lawyers. The Judge in Northampton county decided that courts had discriminating power to reject applications for licenses to sell or dispense liquors, if it is decided that all who conform to the rules shall be licensed. Judge Galbraith, of Erie, decided that no publication of application need be made, while houses must be addressed.
