In the Senate, the vote on the same bill was as follows: In favor of a Protective Tariff, Republicans 21, Democrats 2.

AGAINST A Protective Tariff, DEMOCRATS, 25, Republicans, none. Preserve this record for use. We challenge its denial by any supporter of the Democracy.

Two of these Republicans were from wool growing districts in Ohio. They opposed the duty on wool, which they thought operated against their immediate districts—but approved of the general scope of the bill, and are Protectionists.
