A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING CERTAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof.

SECTION 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual military service under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are, or shall be prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usual place of election.

SECTION 5. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriations bills for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Government.

SECTION 6. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been, or may hereafter be, conferred upon the Courts of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 7. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, which shall take away any property, or interfere with the enjoyment of any franchise, or right, or privilege, without compensation.

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, which shall increase the salary of any public officer, or any member of the Legislature, except as to the term for which such officer, or member, was elected.

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, which shall take away any property, or interfere with the enjoyment of any franchise, or right, or privilege, without compensation.

SECTION 10. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, which shall take away any property, or interfere with the enjoyment of any franchise, or right, or privilege, without compensation.
