AFTERNOON SESSION. Convention met in the Court House at 14 P. M., and was opened with prayer by Rev.

A. W. Guyer. Officers all present. Quite a number of important resolutions were brought before the Convention and adopted. Among the number we find the following most important ones:

Resolved, That we will lend our influence and support to any one who will establish a temperance paper in our State, and we urge our Grand Lodge, at its approaching session, to establish one.

This was amended, so as to authorize the different counties to secure a column in each of the county papers to be devoted to the temperance cause, and as thus amended, it was adopted

WHEREAS, In its inception and early the temperance reform was main ly a religious movement, and in all its history it has been greatly promoted by the christian ministry- and christian churches. therefore

Resolved, That this Convention invites, and expects all good men and women to unite, and be active workers in the promotion of the cause; and it seems to us not improper to look to the christian church to be again foremost in devising the means, and directing the agencies necessary to pro-14 63 teet her membership and society from the evils of intemperance.

Resolved, That the thanks of the delegates to this Convention are due, and are hereby tendered to Chimney Rock Lodge, and the citizens of Hollidaysburg, for their kindness and attention during the period of the Convention.

Resolved, That our thanks are also hereby tendered to the Commissioners of Blair county for the use of the Court House.

The District Deputies of the District were constituted a Committee to prepare business for the next Convention, which is to be held in Bedford, on Wednesday, Aug. 15th, 1866.

Verbal reports were then made by dele gates from each of the lodges represented. These reports show a membership of over 1,000 in this district.

The Two Men.

The York True Democrat, in discussing the merits of the candidates now before the people of this State for the office of Governor, draws a parallel between Geary and Clymer. He voted and acted with that party, that said the South was guilty of no crime in attempting to destroy the government; that the power of slavery was a Constitutional prerogative, possessed by every State; that Mr. Lincoln was a tyrannical usurper, seek-ing to subvert the Constitution and destroy liberty; that derided the soldiers, calling them "hirelings" and "mercenaries," and denying them the right to vote, and then when the end was in full view, had the bra-

zen effrontery to call the war a "failure. The war was either right or wrong. It was a high and holy struggle for the rights of man, or it was the most stupendous and terrible crime that ever convulsed society. The government of the United States either performed the most praise worthy and glorious act recorded in history, or it was guilty of the most heinous and atrocions wrong that was ever done. If the South was justified in her course, and the war upon our part was unjust then Mr. Clymer is a patriot, the lustre of whose loyalty is as the noonday sun. But if the Southern people had neither cause nor excuse for what they at-tempted to do, then the name of Mr. Cly-mer and his associates will go down in history covered with a deeper and blacker infamy than that which attaches itself to the name of Arnold, and the tories of the revolution. If the cause of the government was just, and the struggle a holy one, then the name and fame of General Geary will be immortal. His courage, daring and gallantry, upon many bloody fields of the war for the Union, are written with a diamond pen upon the pages of history. Shall this gallant soldier be honored for the glorious deeds he has done in honor of freedom and the rights of humanity? Let the ballot-box answer in an overwhelming majority at the coming

Reports have been received at Chattanooga of the murder, at Reseca, Ga., of a Union man named Willis, on his way home from church with his wife. Six men, armed with guns, suddenly appeared on the roadside and ordered him to halt. The rest immediately fired, all the shots taking effect killing Willis at once. After cursing and abusing his wife, the murderers fled.

In Overton county, Tennessee, last week, some outlaws went to the house of Mr. Gunter, took him to the wood, stripped him, and severely whipped him. His daughter seized a hatchet, rushed to the spot and kill-ed two of the ruffians. Mr. Gunter and his daughter had to leave the neighborhood.

The Tennessee House of Representatives has passed a resolution, by a vote of 45 to 11, declaring that Jeff. Davis and other leading rebels have forfeited their lives, ought to suffer death and held infamous forever.
