county is four thousand dollars (\$4,000) Court House Bonds. The amount due from Collectors is two hundred and thirty-nine dollars and four cents (\$239.04). The amount due from lands returned by Collectors, is three hundred and eighty-three and fifty-two cents (\$383.52); and from unreturned land fourteen thousand five hundred and twelve dollars and thirty-five cents (\$14,512.35), leaving an available fund due the county to be applied toward defraying the expenses of the year 1868 of fifteen thousand four hundred and fifty-five dollars and twenty-three cents (\$15,456.23), subject to the usual exonerations, Treasurer and Collector's per centage.
