These statistics show that the Lutheran Church in the world is larger than all the other Protestant Churches combined; that even in the United States she is numericaly the third denomination, numbering more communicants than any other Church, except the Methodist and Baptist; and that the ratio of her increase in this country has been very great.

Ready money is always a friend in need. 8 Avoid borrowing and lending as far as possible. 9 Liquor drinking, smoking cigars, and chewing tobacco, are terrible habits to a young man; they impair the mind and pocket, and lead to a waste. They tend to lower a man, never elevate and lift him up in the regard of the virtuous and good.
