TO MAKE A WASHING FLUID.-Take salsoda, one pound; unslaked lime, half a pound put them in five quarts of water, and boil a short time, stirring occasionally; then set off to cool, and after the liquid has settled, pour it into a stone jug, and cork for use. Soak your white clothes until they are wet throug; wring out, and soap wristbands and dirty places. Have your boiler or kettle half filled with water, and when at scalding heat, put in one common teaspoonful of the fluid. Stir it well, then put in your clothes rub through one suds only, rinsing well in the blueing water, and your clothes will look better when dried, than if rubbed through two suds before boiling.
