When you wake up, do not roll over but roll out. It will enable you to ditch all your sloughs, break them, harrow them, and sow them with timothy and red clover. One bushel of clover to two bushels of timothy is enough.

Make your fencing high and strong so that it will keep cattle and pigs out. If you have brush make your lots secure, and keep your hogs from the cattle, for if the corn is kept clean they will eat it better than if it is

Be sure to get your hands to bed at seven o'clock-they will rise early by force of circumstances. Pay a hand; if he is a poor hand, all you promise him; if he is a good hand pay him a little more; it will encourage him to do still better.

Always feed your hands as well as you do yourself, for the laboring men are the bone and sinew of the land, and ought to be well treated.
