for the farmer.

To DRY AND COOK CORN:-To dry corn for winter use is not always an easy matter when done in the ordinary way; but it is so good a dish when properly cooked, and comes in such good play during the winter and spring months, when the good housewife is often puzzled what to cook, that all should have a supply; and for those who have no better fixtures for drying. I would reccommend the hot bed. Place the parboiled corn, cut from the cobs, on boards, or sheets in the hot-bed, or other frame, and put on the sash, raising them a couple of inches each end, the sun shining in will make it so hot, that the corn will dry perfeetly in one day; and the heat will be so great that not a fly will go near it, and should a shower come up it will be quite safe where it is, and ready to take advantage of the first bit of sunshine; when properly dried it will last for years. To cook it, put it in a tin or other vessel with a lid, pour on enough hot water to cover well, set on a stove where it will remain near the boiling point, but should not boil, leave on three to four hours, then take half cup of cream, into which stir a teaspoonful of flour, and pour into the dish with corn, or instead of cream use milk, and add a small piece of butter; season with a teaspoonful of sugar and a little salt, set on the stove half ap hour longer and it is done.

IT is the easiest thing in the world to keep butter sweet. Simply put it in clean jars, and cover with a strong brine. This will keep pure butter a year, fresh and sweet, as we know by experience. It is al most equally good to put in oak casks, headed tight. This is equivalent to canning fruit. The brine, in case of jars, acts as a hending, keeping the air out. But butter w. rowell. should be made well; we have never experimented on poor butter. Work out the butter milk till you have only pure beads, clear as rain water; but do not work so much as to break the grain, in which case you have a tough, heavy mass in winter, and grease in summer. Such butter we advise no one to try to preserve.

To Pickle Peaches.-Take any quantity of good ripe peaches, wipe them clean, lay them one day in good brine, take them out and pour sufficient cold vinegar over WOOD WORKING MACHINERY, them; add a few speenfuls of allspice, let them, and pour good cold spiced vinegar their line of business, such as over them; let them stand one day and they are fit for ure.
