JOINT RESOLUTION PRO- VINCING CERTAIN AGENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION. Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly, that...

Section 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual military service, and a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth, shall require any of the qualified electors to be absent from their usual place of abode, they shall be deemed to be present at their usual place of abode, if they are present at the polls on the day of election.

Section 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in its title, except appropriation bills.

Section 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers or privileges is not conferred upon the Legislature by the Constitution, or by the provisions of the tenth article thereof.

Section 10. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in its title, except appropriation bills.
