ARMY OF THE CUMBERLAND. A Great Battle in Georgia A DESPERATE STRUCCLE REPULSE OF THE REBELS The Enemy Reinforced TEMPORARY REVERSE. OUR POSITION RECAINED

Gen. Lee said to be in Command of the Bebels.

HEADQ'S ARMY OF THE CUMBERLAND, 3 Miles from Crawfish Springs, Sept. 19. An engagement begun this morning at eleven o'clock with a heavy attack on Gen. Thomas, forming the left wing; but at first was thought to be merely a feint. The left was composed of McCook's and Crittenden's troops thrown in as convenience offered, the main portion of each being on the march at the time. The fight on the left was'very desperate. The enemy was repulsed, but on being reinforced regained their position, from which they were subsequently driven, after a desperate engagement of an hour and a half. Gen. Thomas charged them for nearly a mile

punishing them severely. About 2 P. M. the rebels made a dash a the centre, composed of Van Cleve's and Reynold's divisions. The former was struck on the right flank, and being vigorously pushed. fell back until the centre was broken and the troops much scattered. Gen. Thomas on the left, and Gen. Davis on the right, threw forward their forces vigorously towards the gap, and after a hard fight recovered the lost ground. The fight on the extreme right has been light, the enemy apparently purposing to get between us and Chattanooga. The general angagement ended by 40'clock

P. M. Gen. Palmer, who had gathered the scattered forces, and Gen. Negley, who had been sent from the right flank to feel the centre, pushed forward and re-established our line as it had been before, parallel with and along the Chicaminga creek. The country is level, and thickly over-

grown with small timber and brush, unfavorable to the use of artillery, and very little has been used.

The battle thus far has been a bloody one. Our loss is very heavy, and the prisoners say that some of their regiments were almost annihilated.

Deserters say that after strengthening Sumter and planting more batteries on James Island, General Beauregard intends to assume the offensive in order if possible, to gain possession of Morris Is-land. Charleston is said to be full of rebel troops.

Other accounts state that it may be a week yet before General Gilmore can open fire up-on Charleston. The mounting of guns on the north end of Morris Island proves very slow work, but our losses there from the reb el fire have been trifling.

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States of America has ordained that the privilegi of the writ of hadeas corpus shall not be suspended unless, when in cases of liebellion or invasion, the public, safety may require it; and whereas, a Rebellion was existing on the 3d day of March, 1863, which Rebellion is still existing; and whereas, by a statute, which was approved on that day, it was enacted by the Senate and Honse of Representa-tives in Congress assembled that, during the present in-surrection, the President of the United States, whenever in his judgment the public safety may requires is suthor-ized to suspend the writ of hadeas corpus in any case throughout the United States or any part thereof; and whereas, in the judgment of the President of the United States the public safety does require that the privilege of the said writ shall now be suspended throughout the United States, or the cases whereby, the authority of the President of the United States, or any of them hold persons under their command or in their custody, either as prisoners of war, spiles, or acamen, enrolled, drafted, or mustered or enlisted in, or belonging to the land or naval officers, oldiers, or seamen, enrolled, drafted, or mustered or enlisted in, or belonging to the land or naval officers, oldiers, or asamen, enrolled, drafted, or mustered or enlisted in, or the rules or for resulting a draft, or for any other offenses against the military or naval sorvice: Notherwise answerable to military law, or the rules and articless of war, or the rules of the verit of habeas corpus is suspended throughout the United States in the several cases before mentioned, and that this suspension will continue throughout the United States, the hewrit of the babead or naval officers in the military and naval services of the United States, to inded States, do hereby proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern, that the privilege of the
