REPORT OF THE MARKETS

Philadelphia Markets. Philadelphia, Nov. 3, 1863. FLOUR.—Sales of 1580 bbls. common extra family at \$6 75, and about 700 bbls. good do., in lots at \$6 50 to \$6 75 for old stock and \$7 25 for fresh ground. The sales to the trade are limited within the range of \$5 60 to \$6 75 for superfine, \$6 50 to \$6 75 for extra family, and \$8 00 to \$8 50 for fancy brands, &c. in quality. RYE.—In scarce, and selling in lots, on arrival, at \$6 75 bbl. CORN MEAL is quiet, and without any alteration to note.

WHEAT.—Sales of about 10,000 bushels to note at 147 1/2c for fair to good and prime western and Pennsylvania rye, mostly at 147 1/4c for the former. Some choice lots brought 152 1/2c, and white, which is scarce, 176 1/2c. RYE is dull, and prime sells slowly at 120c. CORN is scarce and firm, with sales of 5000 bushels western mixed and yellow in lots at 105 1/2c. OATS continue steady at 83c weight.
