

CANAL AND RAILROAD TRAVELLING.—Mr. G. Converse, of Columbia, Pa., has exhibited to us the model of a new mode of conveying passengers and freight by railroad and canal, which is well calculated to obviate the difficulties of transition from one mode of conveyance to the other and is also designed to supersede the section boats now in use. The canal boat is propelled by steam, and is constructed upon a new principle, so as to avoid injury in the banks of canals by the action of the paddle wheels, and carries six moveable cabins, which may be thrown into a single dining room, or separated into distinct state-rooms. These cabins may be readily shifted with their baggage, freight, or other contents, to railroad tracks, upon which they form convenient cars. They are so constructed as to afford convenient sleeping room each for six persons, and the inventor is sanguine that they will receive universal approbation, and by the ease and expedition with which they may be transferred from the boats to the tracks, and back again, will economize at least twenty-four hours of the time so consumed in the passage from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh.—Phil. Ledger.
