We see that where the right course is pursued with an orchard from the beginning, its proper culture is tolerably clear; but supposing it has been in sod for a number of years, what then as to be done? The sod is to be broken up, so much iscertain but how? If done with a plow, to a depth of more than three inches, it will be sure to tear up a perfeet net-work of roots all over the orchard. But if the plowcan be set to a depth of three inches, and firmly held there, that will be the best way of breaking up the sod. Repeated harrowings with a sharp-toothed harrow might do it, but not so well as the plow.

To sum up the end to be accomplished in the culture of an orchard, is to keep a clean mellow surface above the roots, and leave them to grow, undisturbed by any implement of cultivation.—American Farmer.


