PROFESSIONAL CARDS.

At 7 o'clock he takes his supper, which consists of precisely the same materials as his breakfast, eschewing tea and coffee as before. Between 8 and 9 o'clock he retires to bed.

This course of treatment tends to develope and harden the muscles, while it diminishes the fat, which is thereby converted into muscle. To this end, the "buffer" is forbidden to cat anything of a greasy or sloppy nature. None of his food is boiled, stewed, or fried. It is all broiled.






