SUICIDE .- ROMANTIC INCIDENT. -The Coroner reports the following case: Rudolph Wilkins was born in France, of very street. respectable parents. A witness to these domestic troubles, young Rudolph conceived for the persecutor of his mother a profound aversion. One day when he saw his mother succumb under the indignities of her new husband, he killed him. He was then obliged to flee from Germany to escape the law, and he came to America. He was a handsomely formed young man. He went westward, and one day while hunting the elk and buffalo, was made kept with them for three years.

Whilst living with them the grace of his person attracted the attention of the young daughter of the Indian chief, and he married her. In this wedlock he had a son and a daughter. Soon tired, however, of his uncivilized life, he sought a favorable opportunity and made his escape to New Mexico, where he remained some time, and from which place he went to Pike's Peak. Losing in the mining districts all his savings he removed to St. Louis, and he took up his abode at 369 North Main st. He found employment at Belcher's Sugar Refinery. On Monday night, when standing near his bed, with great accuracy he placed the muzzle of a pistol in the region of his heart, and pulled the trigger. The balla large conical one-went through that vital organ, and through the thorax, and was found in the bed on the other side of his body. It seems that Rudolph Wilkins was a name assumed by the deceased, who on coming to St Louis feared the vengeance of some of his Indian relatives .-St. Louis Democrat.


