

New Arrangement.

The Postoffice Department has issued an order that the name of the Postoffice and date of mailing a letter shall be legibly impressed or written upon the envelope of the letter, and the dating stamp not to be impressed over the postage stamp as is now done. This is a matter which would greatly promote the convenience of business in all parts of the country. Many persons writing to an office or business establishment neglect to give the name of the post town from which they write, and frequently they do not even give the name of the county in which they reside. The dating stamp of the postoffice would supply this omission of negligent correspondents, if it was always legible, but every man's experience will bear witness to the unsatisfactory character of the information imparted in this quarter. The stamp is illegible, having the letters either only half formed, or only half of them printed. So far as it is a source of information, the duty of stamping them might as well have been omitted.

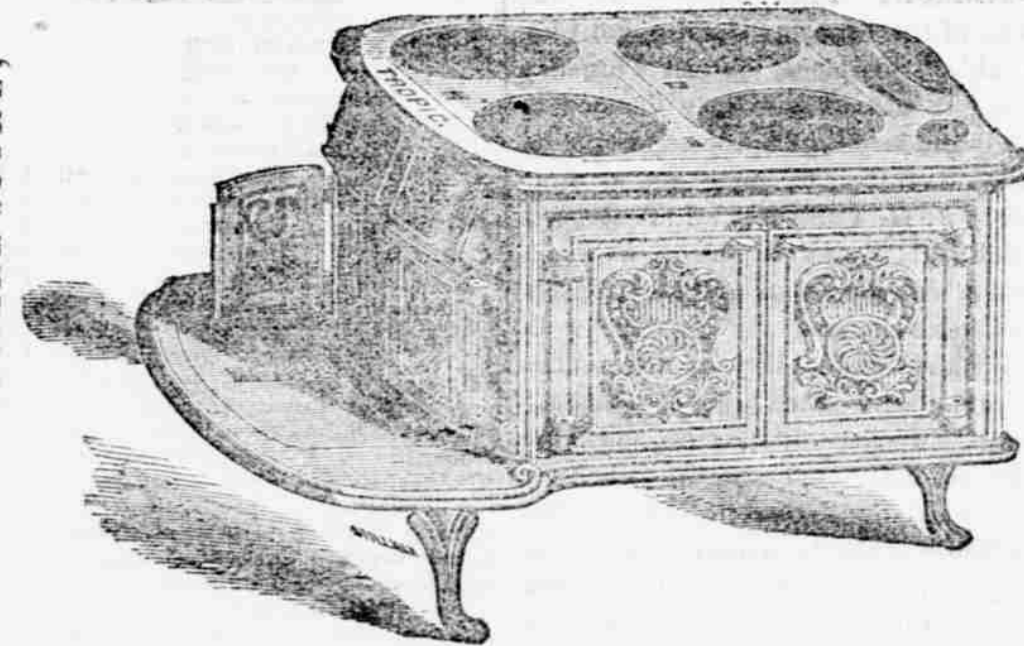
