TOMATO CATSUP.—As the time has arrived for enjoying this favorite sauce we give the following recipe for making it.—Wash the tomatoes and slice them; put them into a kettle with as much water as will cover them, boil until soft and strain them through a cullender; put the juice again into the kettle and boil three hours, then measure it; put it again into the kettle and bring to a boil, then to 1 of strained juice add 4 table-spoonful of salt, 4 of black pepper, 1 of cayenne, 2 of cloves, 3 of allspice, 1 of cinnamon, 4 of mustard, 1 tea-cupful of sugar, 1 quart of vinegar. (A little more sugar, say 1 1/2 tea-cupful will improve it.) Mix the above spices in a little of the juice before putting them into the kettle, and boil a short time after putting them in.
