The committee on farms of the State Agricultural Society of Wisconsin, have made a careful estimate, from which they set down the wheat crop of Wisconsin for the year 1860 at twenty-two millions of bushels. This will probably exceed the erop of any other State in the Union. In 1850 according to the census, the heaviest wheat growing State was Pennsylvania whose crop amounted to 15,367,691 bushels. The crop of Wisconsin in that year was 4,286,131 bushels. For a comparatively young State, the crop estimated for the present year is amazing.
