The poor little fellows that have the misfortune to come along first, have to educate parents to their task, and in the process they get spanked and shaken and abused. After a man has three or four children, he learns that whipping or striking a child less than two years of age is barbarism. We knew one "paternal head" who struck his first child when only six weeks old, he actually believing the child knew better than to cry, and that he stopped crying at that particular time because he struck him. 
