WHAT IS A RATION ?- For the information of numerous inquirers, we give the following list of articles constituting a ration, from the army regulations:

20 oz Fresh and Salt Beef or 12 oz Pork. 18 oz Soft bread or Flour, or 12 oz Hard

Bread. 23 oz Beans or 1 3-5 oz Rice.

1 5-6 oz Sugar.

1 oz Coffee, ground.

1 oz Candles. 3 oz Soap. d oz Salt.


