

HUNTINGDON, June 11, 1873. MEN WANTED FOR THE INVALID CORPS. Only those faithful soldiers who, from wounds or the hardships of war, are no longer fit for active field duty will be received. into this Corps of Honor. Enlistments will be for three years unless sooner discharged. Pay and allowances same as for officers and men of the United States Infantry; except that no premiums or bounty for enlistment will be allowed. This will not invalidate any pensions or bounties which may be due tor previous services.

All persons honorably discharged from the service, not liable to draft, whether they have served in this war or not, can be admitted into this Corps of Honor.

Men who are still in service and unable to perform effective field, may be transferred to this corps.

For the convenience of service, the men will be selected for three grades of duty .--Those who are most efficient and able bodied, and capable of performing guard duty, etc., WOOLLEN GOODS. etc., will be armed with muskets, and assigned A full and complete assortment. to companies of the Frst Battallion. Those of the next degree of efficiency, including those who have lost a hand or an arm; and the least effective, including those who have WHITE GOODS. lost a foot or a leg, to the companies of the Second or Third Battallions; they will be Embracing all the latest styl armed with swords.
