Dear Alleg.: The political ball was opened here on Friday evening last, on the part of the Republican party, by a mass meeting on the public square. The meeting was addressed by Senator Hall, of Blair county, Col. Jordan, Chairman of the State Central Committee, and Hon. Wm. Koontz, of Somerset.
