The benediction was uttered in the solemnity of tone very little in accordance with the twitching of the facial nerves, and when, after the church was closed, the story got amongst the congregation, more than one girl regretted that the young gentleman who really wished to be united in the holy bonds of matrimony had been obliged to depart without a wife.
