OATS .- ()ats are, of course, a most important article in stable management; and | these, as everything a horse eats, ought to boof the finest quality. It may be the't that the weight of oats is not a maker of great consequence, nor, in fact, is it to eart or common borses; but it is quite the reverse to such as we are particular about as to stamina, wind and condition. Horses are generally fed by measure, not by weight, consequently in giving light oats, we netually rob the horse of his proper their Summer stock of goods for '68. quantum of meal, giving him husks instead; and if we feed him by weight, going on the principle that a pound of feathers and a pound of lead are both a pound, the principle would be a very bad one as regards oats; for in that ease, though the horse gets his pound weight, if he gets an undue portion of it in husks he is only filled with that which is no use to bim ; so in every way light oats are bad for HOSIERY, GLOVES, AND KNIT GOODS, choice horses.

READING FOR FARMERS' BOYS .- An intelligent and thrifty farmer says : " But for the co-operation of my boys I should have failed. I worked hard and so did they. The eldest is nearly twenty-one, and the other boys in the neighborhood, younger, have left their parents; mine have stuck to me when I most needed their services. I attribute this result to the fact that I have tried to make home pleasant to them. I have furnished them with attractive and useful reading; and, when night comes, and the day's labor is to the railway station and adjoining towns, they gather around the great lamp, and become absorbed in their books and papers." Such is substantially the testimony of a farmer who has known how hard the struggle for a footing on free soil without capital is, and how valuable and comparatively cheap are the aids which good reading brings him.

AN ICE HOUSE EASILY MADE .- A correspondent of the Western Rural gives this bit of practical experience:- Last January I drew one load of sawdust and spread on the ground on the north side of my horse barn, then drew the ice (sawed in square cakes) and built up a square pile high, filling up the spaces between the cakes with pounded ice. I then set up scantling and built a board house around it two feet larger each way than the ice; then filled in saw dust around, and two or SWISS CURTAINS, three feet on top, and covered with boards and slabs. We have used freely through the season, sold to pionic parties, given away to sick neighbors, and have plenty of ice yet.

CARD THE COWS .- One would think that any kind-hearted man, when he sees how grateful this operation is to a cow, would be willing to spend a few moments in carding her. It pays as well to clean a cow as a horse. All who have fairly tried it find great benefit from the operation. And not one farmer in a hundred makes it a practice to use the card or curry comb in the cow stable. We know stupid men who laugh at the idea as a mere notion of some fancy farmer. But, in point of fact, no cow can give the best results at the pail unless this matter is attended to, especially in winter.
