BEES IN SPRING.—A correspondent says: Now is the time to look after weak colonies and feed all those which need it.

As no pollen will be collected until near the last of May, rye, oat and wheat flour mixed should be put in boxes and put in some sheltered place near the hives.

The bottom boards should be cleaned of dead bees and other filth, which collects during the winter, as this would save the bees a vast amount of labor.
