MANURES .- The failure to raise good crops of wheat upon land long cultivated is not so often attributable to different seed as unfair cultivation. In most cases the soil has been robbed of the wheat producing properties, such as the phosphates, potash and other salts. This is true in a large degree of the wheat growing section of the older States, where the soil has been so long drained of its substance that it is no longer possible to raise a heavy crop of wheat in the best season. Oa such lands farmers should apply bone dust, or soluble bone dust, or bone super-phosphates and ashes to restore the potash. Lime should be used to gather carbonic acid. Lime deposited in large piles will collect carbonic acid from the air and become a better fertilizer. Lime should be applied with which it acts chemically and produces plant food. It also corrects the sours acid in the soil. Some fields need sulphuric acid which is supplied by sowing plaster.

Sown upon clover, plaster causes it to draw to it the ammonia from the air and water, and if the clover be plowed down when in full bloom and quick lime be used the clover is converted into plant food.

The best fertilizer in the experience of the writer is a compost of muck, barn-yard manure and clay, thoroughly decomposed and mixed with equal parts of lime, ashes, salt, plaster, and bone phosphate. No soil except a virgin soil will tail to produce wheat with this compound. It should be thoroughly mixed and screened, so that it can be drilled in with the wheat. It should be used in the Fall, when the rain helps to decompose it and to enrich surrounding soil, and when the grain roots are ready to take up the parts most needed for food for the wheat plant. Plant roots do not permeate manures and take them up until they are decomposed by the action of the moisture, and in times of great drought manures yield very little nourishment. When the moisture penetrates the soil the roots of plants search for nourishment, and if the soil be loose they can penetrate the particles and

proportion of salts, and these must be FRINGED HACK, DIAPER AND DAMASK supplied if the farmer wishes to enrich HONEY COMB QUILTS, the soil and raise large crops of grain.

CORN FOR FODDER .- At the North, corn may be sown for fodder at any time, from the usual corn-planting season until the middle or end of June, the only HASSOCKS, FLOOR CLOTHS, &c., &c., requirement being to allow time for the fodder to mature sufficiently, which is usually indicated by the edges of the leaves beginning to become dry. Northern corn might doubtless be sown in North Carolina as late as August, but the larger Southern sorts which grow longer, should be sown earlier. If the soil is dry, it must be planted deeper. We have been in the practice of sowing it for fodder for more than twenty years, and find no mode better than to plow and harrow the ground, furrow it out three or four feet apart, strew the corn along the furrows by hand from a basket, at the rate of three bushels per acre, and harrow it in. It is afterwards cultivated two or three times by horse. Cut with a scythe or corn-cutter, FEED, VEGETABLES, &c. bind, and set up in large even shocks, and allow it either to remain till wanted, or else stack in small stacks, with three rails | Corn, Oats, set upright in the middle, half a foot or more apart, to make a chimney for the escape of the hot air of fermentation. Stacked in the common way, it will heat and spoil. It is one of the best substitutes for hay, and is much sheaper than hay at \$10 per ton.

To MAKE COWS GIVE MILK .- A writer says:-If you desire to get a large yield of rich milk, give your cow, three times a day, water slightly warm, slightly salted, in which bran has been stirred at the rate of one quart to two gallons of water. You will find, if you have not tried this daily practice, that your cow will give twenty-five per cent more immediately under the effect of it, and she will become so attached to the diet as to refuse to drink clear water, unless very thirsty; but this mess she will drink almost any time, and 'ask for more."
