

The Farmers' Department.

RURAL TASTE.—It is a common mode of thought to assert that the farm and the home should be the spot in which a tasteful rural ornament can be most appropriately and successfully developed. This is true, but as a sequence from other beginnings, and we are disposed to attribute the education of one's taste as much to the associations of the school-room and grounds as to home associations. If in our country districts the old shabby, red or brown weather-beaten structures were replaced with buildings of an ornamental style of architecture with grounds appropriately laid out and planted in something simple perhaps nothing beyond a pretty lawn plot, surrounded by a neat fence, and planted in evergreens, we feel sure that the constant sight of this pleasant object, and the associations naturally formed in the mind of the scholar, would do far more good than centuries of lectures or libraries of books.

The taste of a child comes from the school-room as well as the home, and goes from the one to the other. Hence we make a plea not only for the improvement of our country school-houses, but for the importance of extending this subject even beyond to college grounds. In the minds of college managers it seems only necessary to secure the ground, "the terra firma," and then build their massive walls, and when that is done, all is done. Not so, indeed. Thousands of young men and women frequent these grounds day after day and year after year. If the grounds were well laid out and tastefully displayed, there is an opportunity presented for the development and culture of a refining taste, such as no musty literature ever possessed. It is practical, too, and will sensibly help to mould the future disposition and character, and act as a spur to the youth of the country and at the fountain heads of education.

SOILING MILK COWS WITH CORN FODDER.—A falling off in milk, and the neglect to provide food for soiling, induces many to turn stock upon meadows early, and before they have become thickly coated with autumn. It is bad economy, very injurious to meadows, while the seemingly "fed" feed is swept away in a few days, and a scanty yield of milk is the result for the balance of the season. There is no crop, therefore, that pays the dairyman better, one year with another, than the few acres devoted to corn fodder. Corn fodder should be fed in the stalls, as there is then no waste, besides the stock thus fed are more quiet and less disposed to hang about, waiting for their feed, as they do when the fodder is given them in the open field. Each cow in the stall gets its proper share of food, and there is no hooking nor soiling of the fodder, by master cows. The herd should be fed regularly at stated hours, and they will soon become accustomed to the stables, and during other portions of the day they will feed more in the pastures.

Corn fodder for soiling should be wilted before feeding. It is a good plan to cut in the morning and let it lay in the sun till afternoon, and then feed. In this way some of the external moisture will be got rid of, and the food will be preferred by animals and produce better results. Corn fodder is very succulent, and does not need to be still further diluted by feeding when dew or water is adhering to it. Better reduce the water in it by wetting and partially drying.

Corn now requires thorough cultivation and cleaning, to make it ready for the hot weather of July and August.
