The Farmers' Department.

Do CATTLE LOSE THEIR CUDS ?- I think they do not, but I know of a number of persons who, as soon as an ox or a cow is taken sick from any cause, (and of course the animals do not chew thair end while sick), make them a cad; some using codfish skin and sweet elder bark and yeast, another preparing a wad of hay in some mysterious way, another giving a piece of salt pork. Of course none of those things will hurt the animal The queston is, where do they get the first end? It is certainly not made by the hand of man, and put into the call's mently on the contrary, the little calf of three or four week's old is seen chewing its cud. In my opinion, when animals are taken sick, no matter what causes the sickness, they stop chowing their end from the same reason that a person loses his appetite, but as soon as they are restored to health by letfing nature have its course, or by assisting sature by some wild medicine; they get well, and their appetite returns and they will raise and chew their cud as before.

Toans .- In consequence of the instinctive appetite of the toad for living insects a rapid digestion and capaious memdrancous stomach capable of remarkable distention, toads are incalculably useful to the gardener by protecting his under vines from the nocturnal depreditor. Both ttoads and frogs eatch their own prey with the point of their tongue. It is a marvelously constructed organ-occupying but little room at the end of the gullet -appearing like a small fleshy eminence on opening the jaws; it is singularly elastic, and may be projected at the pleasure of the animal, six or eight inches, and perhaps more. The projectile force is exerted with the quickness of a flash of light. An extremely tenscious sccretion exudes frum it so sticky that the slightest touch with the object at which it is thrust holds it firmly; and the contraction of the fibres instantly delivers the struggling captive exactly at the opening of the fauces, where is is taken off, as our teeth detach a morsel from times of a fork.

TO KEEP THE BUGS AWAY .- Prot cet your melon, squash and cucumber vines thus: Take sticks four inches long and one half inch in diameter-pine is best. Wrap one inch of one end in a piece of cotton or linen. Dip this in turpentine, and stick one or two in each hill, leav. SWISS CURTAINS, ing only the wrapped part above ground.
