MANURING LANDS .- A great mistake among farmers is to wait until their grass begins to run out before they break up the field and seed anew. If a farmer has too little manure, he had better cart what he has, on his best field and take a big crop from that, than to put it on his poorest field to enable it to yield a moderate crop. It is easier to increase a corn crop from 50 bushels per acre to 80, on good land, than to increase it from 15 bushels to 25 on poor land. In the first case your manure gives you a gain of 30 bushels per acre, and the second a gain of only ten oushels. This explains why a farmer with poor land finds it so difficulty to make progress, and especially if his farm is un- CLOTHS, drained. Neither the manure per the labor he applies are nearly so effective as those of his neighbor with richer and better land. In this case it is emphatically true that destruction of the poor is their poverty. Hence we may incidentally remark that through and perfect menuring a small surface is better, and especially on poor ground, than a quantity over a large field. Where the soil is already very rich a litle mannre will go a great way.

" Last year I saw an article recommending the scattering of clair branches over fields as destructive to the cut worms. HOW TURNIPS CAN BE RAISED CHEAP LY .- By sowing the Purple-Top turnip seed at the last dressing of the corn and covering with a light harrow, a couple of lumdred of bushels of the best turnips can be raised with very little trouble. This crop will take the place of the weeds and will not be in the way of harvesting the corn, as it will do the turnips little harm to treat them as though you did not know that the crop was there.
