On our side Atherton and Hartswick in the points showed up finely, while Buzard, Mackey, Stuart and Lowell deserve special praise. Mattern did some heavy hitting, and clever base running, having four runs and three hits to his credit. Robison was laid off in the second inning on account of sickness and Barndollar took his place. Harry the bull-dog was there in all his glory and brought good luck to the team in plenty. Dr. Atherton and Gov. Beaver witnessed the game and took a keen interest in it.
