hundred comfortably, but it will easily accommodate from a hundred and fifty to two hundred more on a pinch. The roof is broad and projecting, with a gable in front. It bears three flagstaffs. The seats are broad and comfortable, the first four rows being furnished with movable backs. Beneath the seats at the back is a ticket office with two stairways leading up from it on the inside. There is also space for dressing rooms and lockers which will in time be fitted up. It is the crowning feature of our fine athletic field, and we take this opportunity of heartily thanking the Legislature for their munificence and the advanced attitude they have taken toward athletics at P. S. C.
