Dr. Gregory is the author of the following books: "A New Political Economy," "Handbook of History," "Map of Time," "Seven Laws of Teaching," "Compend of School Laws."

Perhaps his most important work has been the introduction of Scientific Industrial Education in colleges, he being one of the first organizers of a college of this description.
