440 yards dash, won by Kaiser, '98; second, Fulton; third, Huston, '98. Time, 63 sec.

2-mile bicycle—no entries.

Mile run, won by Espenshade, '98; second, Crewe, '98; third, Huston, '98. Time not taken.

Mile walk, won by Espenshade, '98; second, Young, '00; third, Moser, '98. Time, 8 min. 15 sec.

Half mile run, won by Knox, '02; second, Huston, '98; third, Crewe, '98. Time, 2 min. 12 sec.

220 yards dash, won by Kaiser, '98; second, Norman; third, Fulton. Time, 23 4-5 sec.

220 yards hurdle, won by Maxwell, '02; second, Norman; third, Fulton. Time not taken.

16-pound hammer—not contested.

Pole vault, won by Edwards, '00; second, Boyd, '00; third, Maxwell, '02, and Strohm, '98. Height, 9 feet.

Running high jump, won by Edwards, '00; second, Strohm, '98; third, Kaiser, '98. Height, 5 ft. 3 in.

16-pound shot—not contested.

Running broad jump, won by Rawn, '98; second, Kaiser, '98; third, Pollock, '00. Distance, 21 ft. 1 in.
