STATE VS. WASHINGTON AND JEFFERSON.

UNDER this head we have to chronicle one of the vilest deeds ever perpetrated upon a college foot ball field. W. and J. came to State College with but one intention and that to defeat State at any cost. So finding that as the game progressed her chances of winning were growing more dim, she resorted to a game that is a disgrace to any college. It is true that State endeavored to cancel the game, but the student body would not consent, not knowing the class of men with which they had to deal. But they have learned a dear lesson which would have been avoided had Coach Boyle been listened to.

The 10 minutes of play which was completed was dirty ball from the start, W. and J. endeavoring to put a man out the first rush. Then Bird kicked 38 yards out of bounds, and Burns carried the ball back 28 yards on next play. Burns was given the ball for an end run and skirted the end for 70 yards, when he was tackled from behind by Core out of bounds. Reed came running across the field and when within a few feet of Burns, who was still prostrate on the ground out of bounds, jumped and landed with both knees on Burns' chest, incapacitating him for play for the time being.
