Two years ago the Indians came to State to play the Commencement game and returned with a scalp at their belts; this year they left their own here as a trophy. Because of the serious illness of Dr. Pond the game was played on the campus below Prof. Gill's residence. The rough ground and slippery ball doubled the error list.
