THE NEW MEN AT STATE.

The College has this term enrolled a large Freshman and Sub-Freshman Class. With a few students admitted to advanced standing, they number two hundred and two. There are one hundred forty-eight Freshmen and forty-nine Sub-Freshmen.

This influx of students, together with the departure of some former State teachers for other fields of work, has resulted in bringing several new instructors here. A brief mention of available facts concerning these men cannot fail to be of interest to all readers of the FREE LANCE.

Elton D. Walker, a graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, now occupies the position of Assistant Professor in Civil Engineering. Previous to coming here, Mr. Walker had some ten years' experience in teaching and in professional work, having been, during this period, successively an assistant in the Civil Engineering department of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, a civil engineer in the Quartermaster's Department of the United States Army, a professional worker in Chicago, and a teacher of Civil Engineering at Union University, Schenectady, N. Y.

Dr. H. C. Grumbine, a graduate of Wesleyan University, Conn., has been called to assist in the English and German departments. Dr. Grumbine has spent three years in study in foreign countries, and, while abroad, received his degree of Ph. D. from the University of Munich.

H. A. Surface has taken charge of the department of Biology. He is a graduate of the National Normal University and of the Ohio State University. He has pursued
