THE RELAY RACE

The annual relay meet, held at Franklin field, Philadelphia, April 27, under the auspices of the University of Pennsylvania, closed with the name of State College among the winners. State's class was composed of Dickinson, Bucknell, Carlisle Indians, Ursinus, Gettysburg, and Franklin and Marshall, but the three last named did not compete. The race is said to have been among the best.

Cummings ran the first quarter for State. He had the lead at first, but he had been ill the two days before, and could not hold the pace. The teams finished the first quarter in this order:—Dickinson, Carlisle, Bucknell, and State. Miles ran next for State, passed two of his opponents, and finished second, Dickinson being first, and Carlisle and Bucknell respectively third and fourth. Mott ran next.
