The quarterback started to run with it, but State was on the alert, and as the cry "Look out for a trick play" went around, Smith dove through the line and knocked the quarterback off his As the quarterback was struggling to regain his feet, Biesecker fell on the quarterback's neck and held him fast. The whistle blew, and State had won the game. Score, 11 Capt. Hewitt, of State, by reason of having his knee thrown out of joint but a few days previous, was unable to get into the game.
