State 39—Lehigh 0.

In a very interesting game despite the fact that it was one-sided, State defeated Lehigh at Williamsport on Saturday, Nov. 16th.

Tho this game did not arouse the interest of the students and the Williamsport people as the State-Bucknell games did, yet a good-sized delegation witnessed the game. This was the first time the Blue and White have met the Brown and White on the gridiron for many a year. The last time they met, however, Lehigh had administered a severe drubbing to the State lads. The remembrance of this was probably rankling in the hearts of Captain Hewitt's men, if the manner in which they played the game counts for anything,—and we think it does.

State's team, with about one hundred and fifty rooters, reached Williamsport at 10:30 A. M. The team got off at the Park Hotel while the rooters continued on to the Market street station, where they met about fifty more State men, mostly Juniors, who had gone down the night before. Forming into line with the Scrubs in the lead, followed by the Cadet band, this imposing contingent of Statites paraded to the Park.
