State 12-Dickinson 0.

In the last game of State's season on a field of mud and water, with the elements rain, wind and cold battling against them, State and Dickinson struggled manfully on Beaver Field on Saturday, Nov. 23, 1901, for victory.

This was the long looked for game at State. Both teams were evenly matched and enthusiasm was keyed up to the highest pitch. About one thousand people, students, instructors, visitors and townspeople, turned out despite the inclemency of the weather to witness what they all hoped, Dickinson's downfall. The Cadet Band was on hand and their good music did much to enliven the occasion.

Dickinson came first on the field, followed shortly afterward by State's team, who in their brand new blue sweaters with the white S looked imposing to say the least. After a little practice the captains met and arranged the halves, etc. Ammerman won the toss and chose to defend the east goal with the wind in his favor.

Smith kicked off and Dickinson advanced it to their thirty yard line. On the first play Dickinson fumbled and State had the ball. By steady plunges the ball was soon on Dickinson's ten yard line where a fumble by Scholl lost the ball. In three downs Dickinson made their first down of the first half. Being forced to punt they did with good effect as
