The first base ball trip ended in the defeat of the Middies at Annapolis, April 18th, in a well-played game by a score of 1-0. A high wind is responsible for the scarcity of hits, of which there were only four. State had two errors, against three for the Navy.

Rohrbach reached first on balls in the opening, and State seemed to have a chance for a run, but Miller and McIlveen struck out and Sharpe flew out to right field. Smith was first up for the Navy, and he hit hard to center. The wind was too strong and the ball fell short. Both Sharpe and Elder called Rohrbach, but he could not reach it, and Sharpe in his efforts got a heavy fall. This gave the Middies their only hit.

Until the sixth inning neither side thought of scoring, but here Bradley drew a base on balls and went to second on a passed ball. Rohrbach struck out and Miller was given a pass to first, where Rohrbach took his place. Sharpe, on second delivery, hit a hot liner between first and second, and Rohrbach, not seeing, ran into it. Bradley was held on second. McIlveen sent a rapid grounder through third baseman and Bradley scored. In the eighth Huber captured two difficult flies, picking one from the laps of the spectators.
