The books of the Washington and The Cresson Literary Societies form the nucleus, while to these are added "all works of poetry, fiction, travel and lighter literature." There are about 1500 volumes of this class, which may be withdrawn for a period of one week and subject to one renewal. There is no thought of inflicting upon the COLLEGIAN the list of books thus within the student's reach, but let me name a few of the authors included: Adams, Addison, Allen, Bryer, Browning, Cable, Carlyle, Cooper, Dickens, Emerson, Goethe, Hawthorne, Hearn, Holmes, Lowell, Longfellow, Lessing, Morley, Emerson, Ruskin, Stockton, Stephen Crane, Tennyson, Fanny Fern, Webster, etc.
