Alumni Trustee Regulations

Regulations for the election of Alumni Members of the Board of Trustees, adopted April 7, 1905, in accordance with the provisions of an Act entitled "An Act to Reorganize the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State College," approved March 24, 1905:

(1). All graduates of The Pennsylvania State College of not less than three years' standing (not including the year of graduation) who shall have received the first (or Bachelor's) degree, and all persons who shall have received an advanced degree from said College, whether honorary or otherwise, may cast a written or printed ballot or ballots for three persons at each annual election for members of the Board of Trustees, at such time and
