secured 12 around end and Campbell 1 just as the referee called for "Time"

SECOND-HALF.

Five changes were made in State's line-up:—Albert Yeckley for Henry, Fawkes for Yeckley, Shaw for Putnam, McWilliams for Wray, and Leathers for Barr, while Villanova's Coach Crclins sent on the same eleven after urging them angrily to stop State's rushes.

McGee kicked off to the 6 yard line McAlteer getting 10 back, and McGee being hurt on making the tackle. Then McGeehan chanced tackle for 2, and State's offside play gave Villanova 5 yards more. McGeehan failed to budge State's line on a tackle tandem play, but Slavin made it first down at end, Lacey 4, McAtleer 1. McAtleer then lost on Gotwals fine tackle, and McGeehan broke away for a 60 yard run, but was called back 30 for holding in the interference. Daniels took 3 at tackle, Daniels 3 more, Slavin 1, McGeehan 1, and it was State's ball on downs. McGee took 2 at centre, Fawkes 1, Partridge 5, McWilliams 6, McGee 3, McWilliams 10, Gotwals 1, McGee 10, Gotwals 1, Fawkes 6, and Gotwals over the line, making the score 29 to 0. And thus it remained as the punt out for goal try failed. Zink then went in for McGee.

Moore kicked off to the 5 yard line and Zink showed his mettle by sprinting back 20 yards. Albert Yeckley failed at end, but Fawkes got 3 at tackle, Zink 5, and on a fumble, Slavin darted away for 15 yards, Leathers bringing him down hard. With the ball on States 30 yard line matters looked serious. Slavin got 2 yards at tackle, McGeehan 3 more, but Shaw threw Slavin for a loss, and McAlteer lost more on a fumble. Then McAlteer dropped back to the 30 yard mark

and tried for a field goal. But his attempt was poor; the ball bouncing over States goal line. Fawkes kicked out from the 25 yard mark McGeehan catching the ball on Villanova's 40 yard line. Slavin then lost at Leather's end, and McWilliams broke through on the next play and downed McAlteer for a loss, after which McGeehan got 3 at tackle, and McAlteer punted 30 yards, Leathers plunging 15 yards on the return. Partridge then gained at tackle, Zink broke through for 16, Shaw 5, Albert Yeckley 25 around end on a beautiful run. Gotwals 11, Zink 8, but Referee Robison called him back and gave Villanova 15 yards for State's "holding," thus spoiling the chance for another score. With a grand plunge Zink got through for 12 on the next trial, but Fawkes failed to advance on a fake kick, and it was Villanova's ball. On a double pass Leathers downed them for 3 yards loss, McAlteer lost at Campbell's end, and then punted 30 yards, Yeckley being downed in his tracks. McWilliams gained 6 at tackle, Zink 6 through center and Fawkes 4 at end. "Time," and the game ended with the ball on Villanova's 15 yard line. The score.
