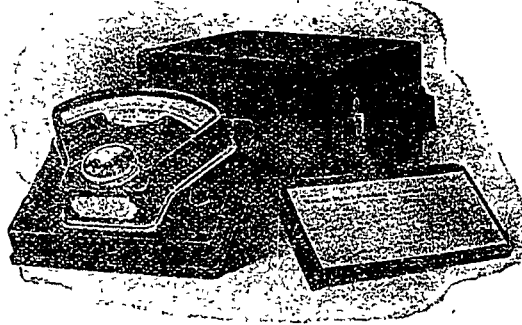

Mitchell, '90, president, and A. C. Reed, '92, of the Alumni Association. These men, forming a trustee-alumni committee, attended a student mass meeting and listened to the grievances. At their request the president appointed a faculty committee to meet the student and the trustee-alumni committees for the purpose of arbitration. Thus the students accomplished their desire to ague personally their side of the case before members of the faculty.

The meeting of the three committees took place last Tuesday afternoon about an hour after the mass meeting. After matters were discussed thoroughly on all sides the points as stated below were arrived at. All the Division Officers will have daily office hours.
