

The Basket Ball Season Opened.

State's team showed evidences of team work which indicate good things for the future, and with hard constant practice our five looks like the best we have ever had, as there is an abundance of good, willing material, in addition to the five regular Varsity men from last season; viz., Heaton, Foltz, Yeckley, Kilmer, and Moorhead. Of the new men in this game, Dubarry, Lauder, Waha, and Ross, all performed in promising fashion and displayed a good knowledge of the game.
