

Revised Base Ball Schedule.

The base ball schedule of Manager J. H. Himes has been largely revised since its original announcement a month ago. A half dozen important changes have been made in the list of dates which now includes twenty-five games, only eight of which are home contests. Georgetown asked to be permitted to drop the State game by reason of the extreme difficulty of her schedule, and the Washington League Team has been scheduled for that date, April 4th. The Johnston Tri State club will also be met in Johnston for their opening game, April 21st, while State's old rival, Fordham, has again been added to the list, also another game with Lehigh, while the games with Dorworth, Syracuse and Colgate fell through on account of conflicting dates.
