ing State from being scored upon. Both sides made three tries at goal from field, but all went wide of the mark.

Captain Sieber won the toss, giving Gettysburg the advantage of the sun and wind. McCleary kicked-off to the visitors' 20 yard line, Pennell getting back 8 yards. Sieber plunged at tackle for a yard gain, then punted 40 yards to Henry who came back 10. McCleary gained 3, Coulson 5, Hirshman 2, Gotwals 3, Maxwell, 1 and McCleary punted 45 yards, the ball rolling out of bounds. On the first line-up for Gettysburg a fumble occurred, and Hirshman fell on the ball.

Hirshman hit the line for 5, and Coulson for 2 more. but Henry was downed without gain on a long pass, the ball going to Gettysburg. Swartz made 2 yards and Sieber punted 50, Henry sprinting back 25; then Coulson rounded the end for 15, and McCleary clipped off 5 at the other extremity. Hirshman 5 through a big hole opened by Kunkle, then 2 more, and State was penalized 10 yards for holding. Coulson got 8 around end, and Hirshman 5 through a fine opening made by Cyphers; McCleary's drop kick from the 35 yard line was blocked, but Henry fell on the ball. McCleary then punted 40, and Sieber punted back 50 yards. The remainder of the half was a punting duel with neither side getting within striking distance of a score. The second half, however, proved more exciting.

SECOND HALF

The Gettysburg team came on the field without a change in their line-up, and only one substitution was made on State's team, Vorhis for Henry. Sieber kicked-off to State's one yard line, McCleary ploughing back for 15 yards. Then came a fumble, but Cyphers recovered the ball.

State could not make the 10 yards, however, and it was Gettysburg's ball on downs. Brumbaugh gained 5 through the line, Himes 2, and with the ball on State's 25 yard line, Sieber attempted a goal from field. Gotwals blocked the kick, and State got the ball amid great excitement. Another fumble by State again gave Gettysburg the ball, close to State's line. Sieber smashed through for 4, Himes got 1, but State held solidly, and threw Sieber back for a loss, and once again the danger was averted, for McCleary made a fine punt of 50 yards, and Sieber was downed almost in his tracks. The Gettysburgers could not gain and Sieber punted 35 from close formation, McCleary catching. Maxwell gained 3, McCleary 5, Hirshman 2, Coulson 2, and McCleary punted 45, Gotwals tackling Sieber fiercely. Sieber at once resorted to a kick but Vorhis fumbled, a Gettysburg player securing the
